EASTER EGG SPECIES IDENTIFICATION GUIDE



A fun, imaginative way to classify Easter eggs! Use this for an Easter hunt or just for fun.

Egg Species	Description	How to Identify
Classic Eggus Pastelus (Pastel Egg)	Traditional Easter egg in soft pastel colors.	Smooth surface, solid light shades (pink, blue, yellow, green, purple).
Shimmering Eggus Metallicus	A rare, shiny egg with a metallic or glittery coating.	Reflects light, may have gold, silver, or glittery specks.
Golden Eggus Maximus (Golden Egg)	The legendary golden egg, often holding a grand prize!	Bright gold color, may be larger than other eggs.
Tiny Eggus Minimus (Mini Egg)	A small but mighty egg, often filled with a tiny surprise.	Much smaller than normal eggs, bright colors.
Gigantic Eggus Gigantus (Jumbo Egg)	A massive egg that holds extra-large surprises!	Oversized compared to others, may have patterns or special designs.
Speckled Eggus Naturalis (Speckled Egg)	Looks like a real bird's egg, sometimes found in nature-themed hunts.	Dotted with small speckles, natural color tones (brown, white, blue).
Camouflage Eggus Sneakius (Camo Egg)	The hardest egg to spot! Designed to blend into surroundings.	Colors and patterns match grass, dirt, or trees.
Glow Eggus Luminus (Glowing Egg)	A magical egg that glows in the dark or under blacklight.	Emits a soft glow, often neon-colored.
Mystery Eggus Surpriseus (Mystery Egg)	No one knows what's inside until opened—could be good or tricky!	May have a question mark, unusual size, or mixed patterns.
